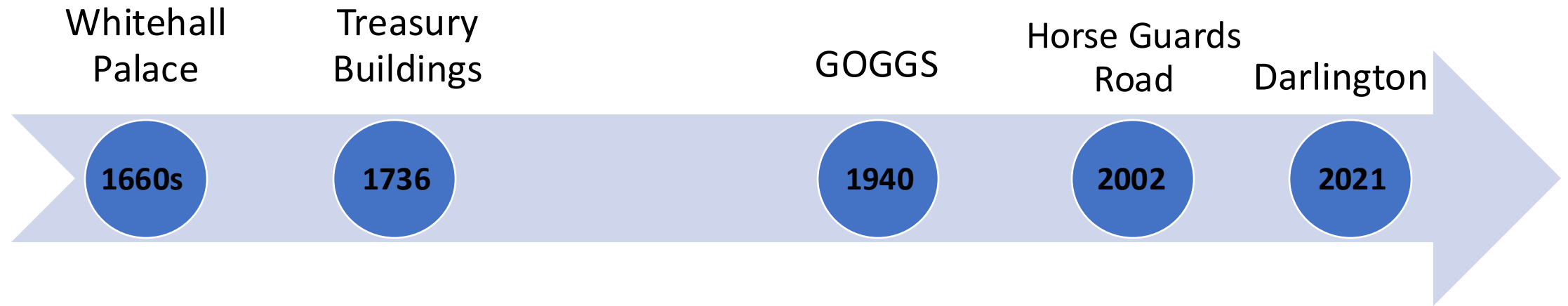

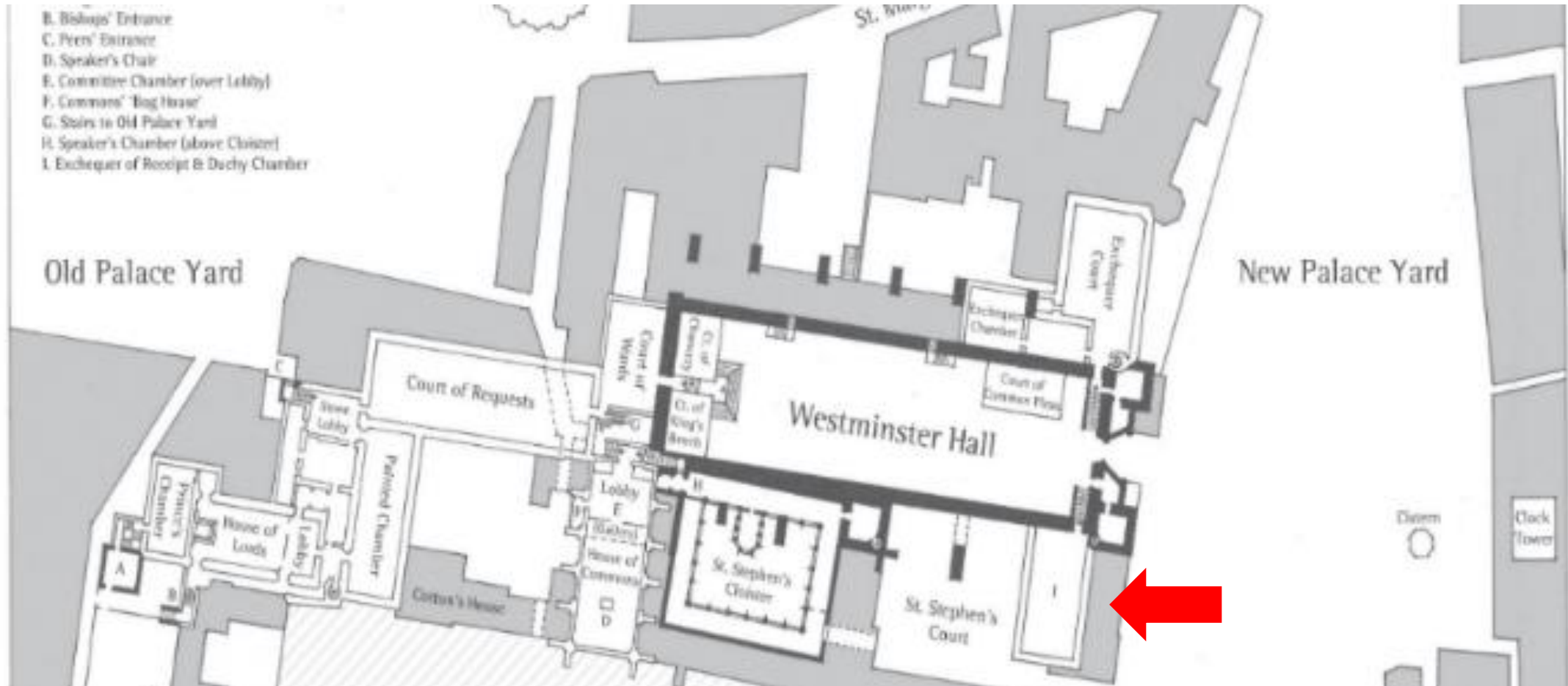




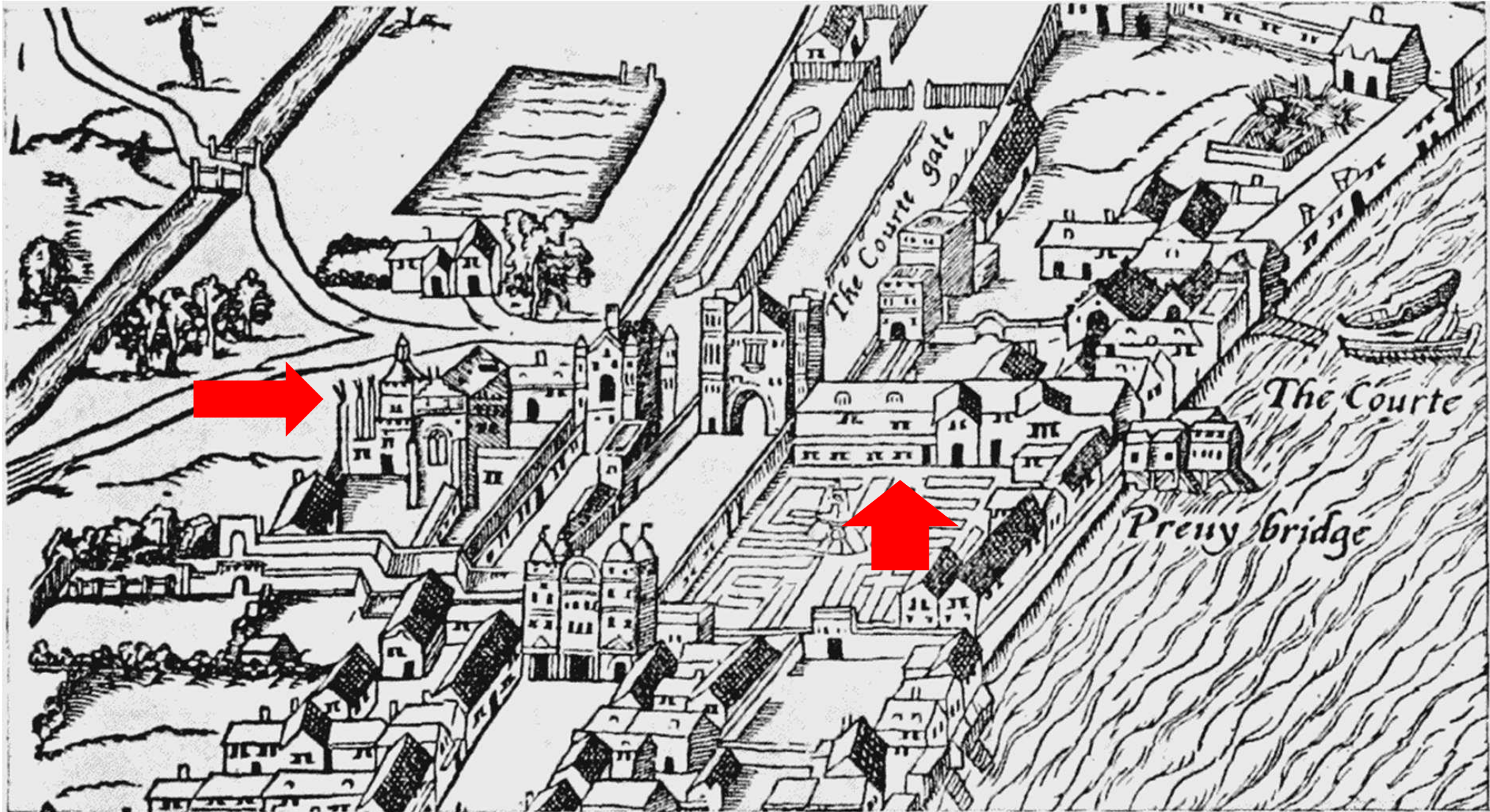
Chronology: 350 years in five sections

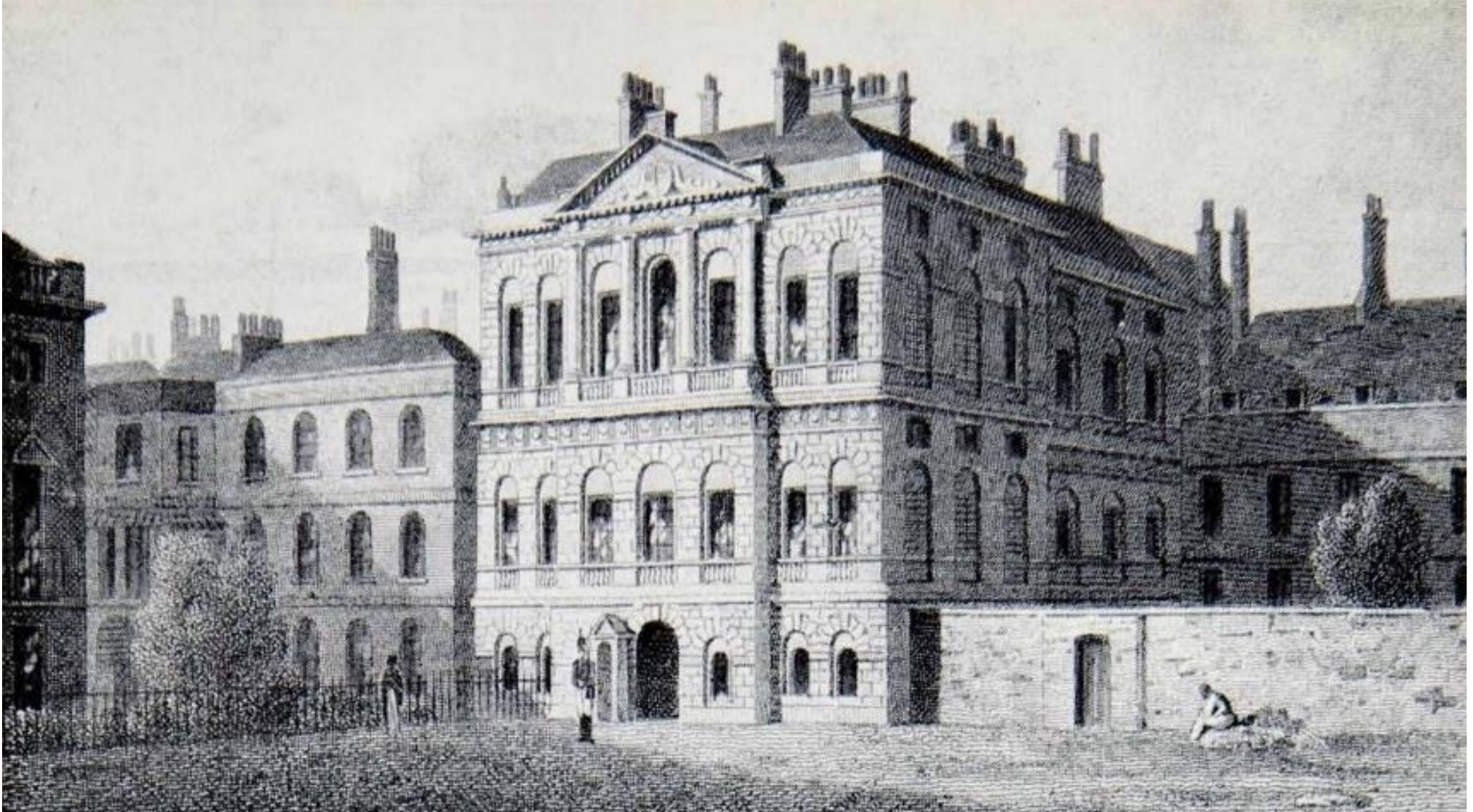


Whitehall Palace fire, January 1698

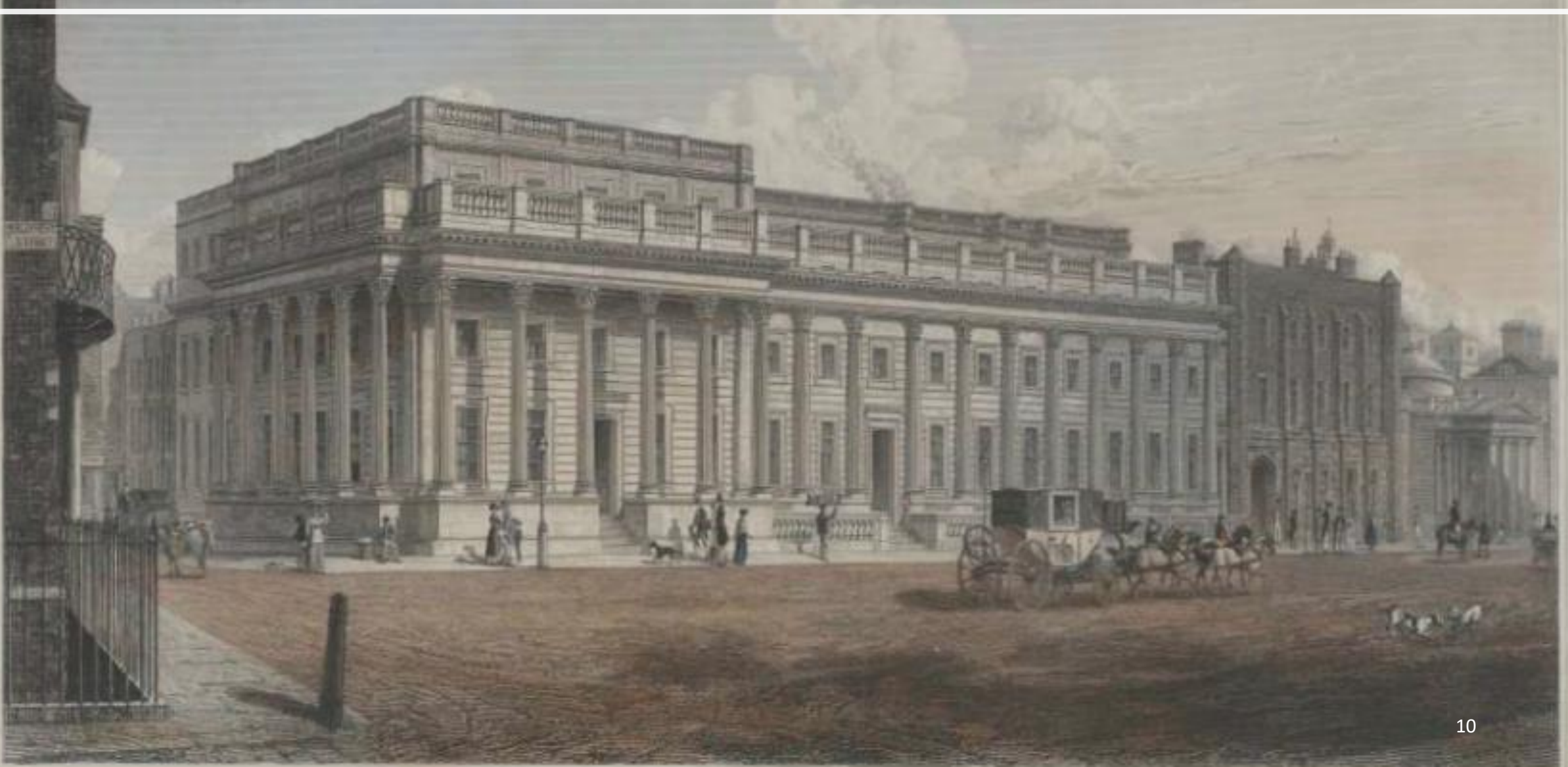
Whitehall from St James's Park (Danckerts) with Cockpit on right



William Kent's Treasury, 1733-1736

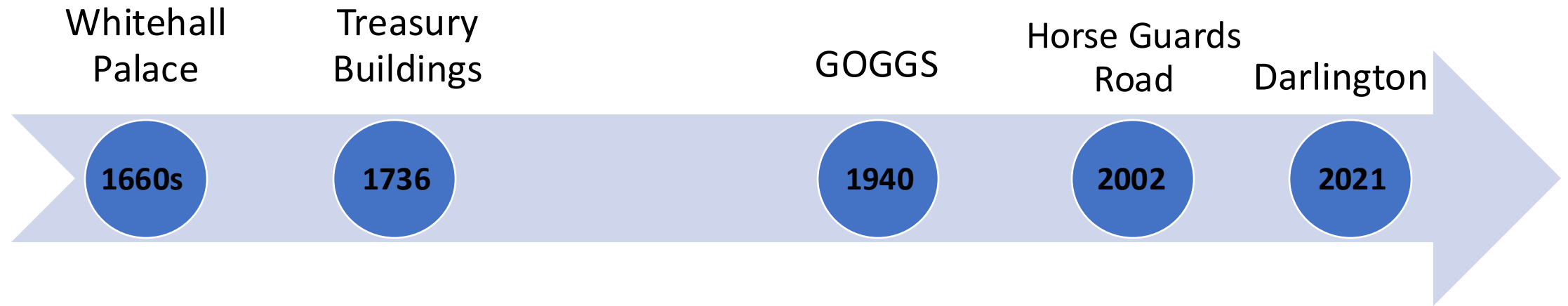

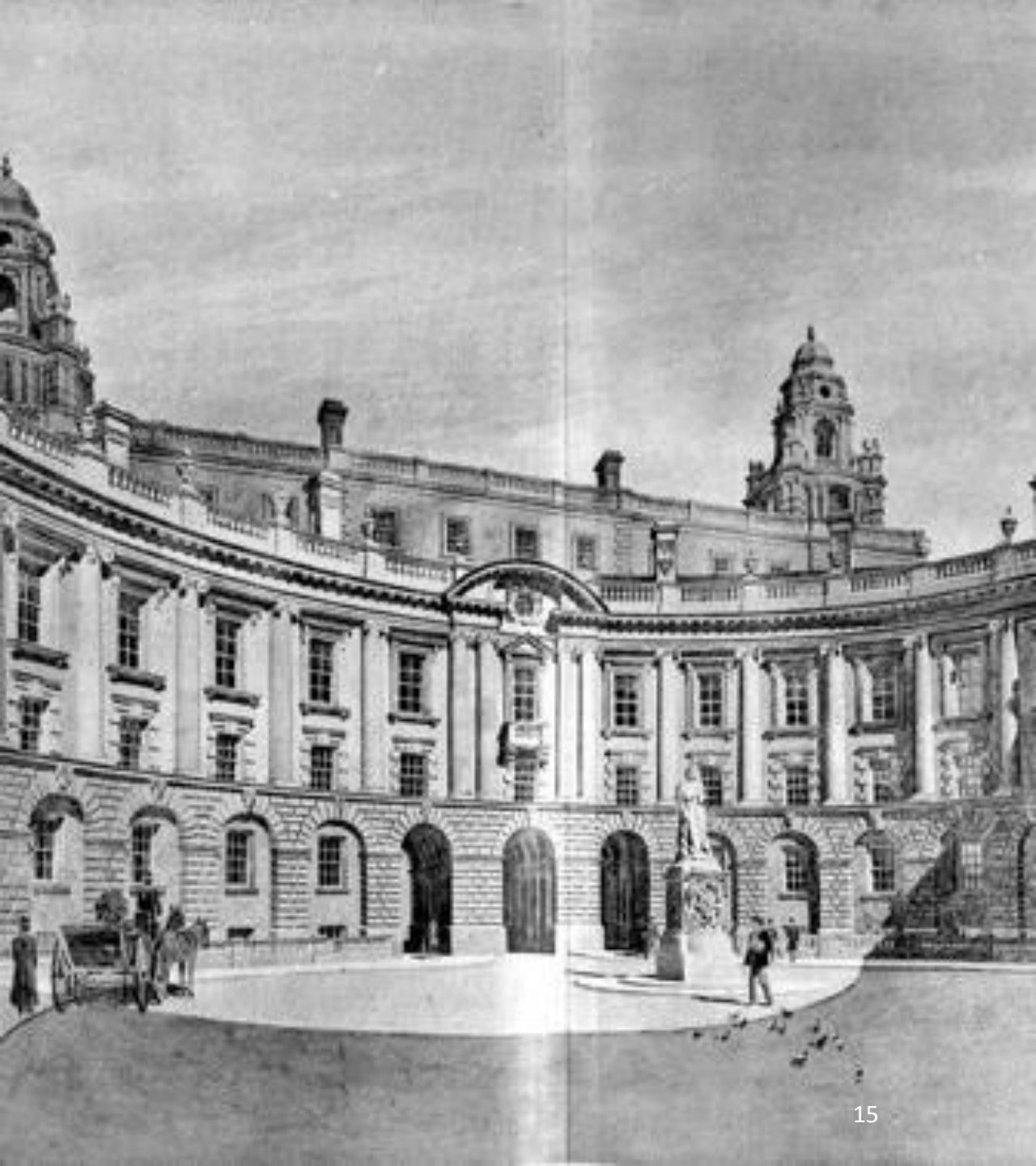

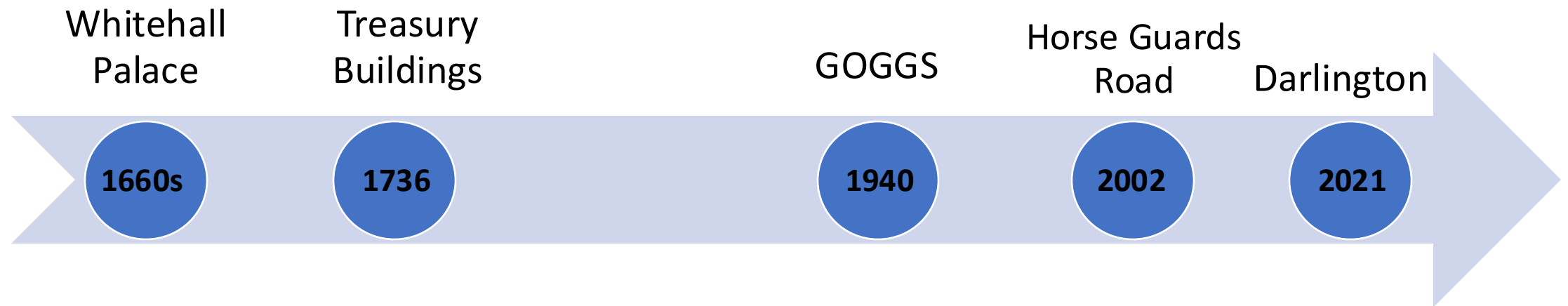

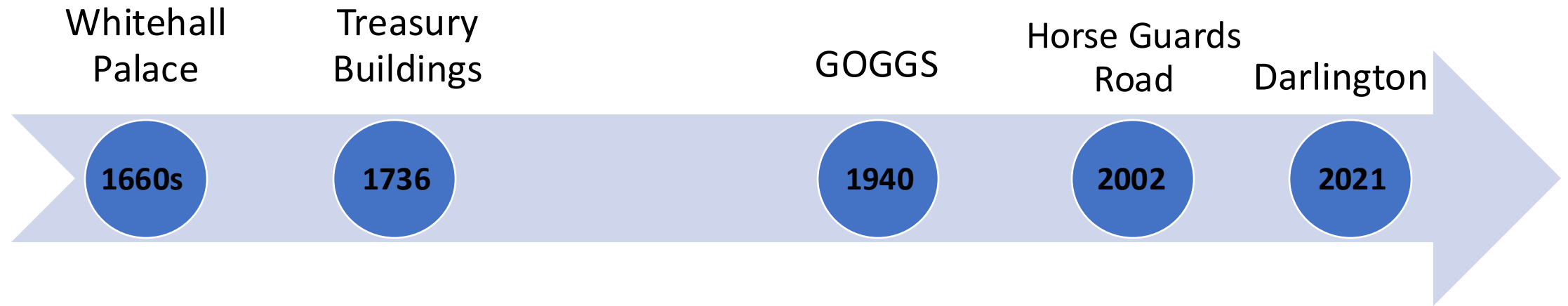
